**CANDIDATE REQUIREMENTS:**

- Only SDSU students who have not been selected to the court in prior years are eligible for SDSU Homecoming Court 2009.
- Students can only be nominated by one recognized student organization, Associated Students Council, Honors Council, or Greek Council.
- Only one nomination is permitted per student organization. Coed organizations may nominate one male and one female.
- Candidates must have completed at least 90 units as of August 31, 2009.
- Candidates must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50.
- Candidates must not be on academic or judicial probation. If students are academically or judicially put on probation during the selection process, the nominee will be automatically disqualified.
- Candidates must be an active, unpaid member of the nominating organization.

**DEADLINE:**

- Six (6) copies of your application are due Wednesday, September 23<sup>rd</sup> by 4:00pm. **No late applications will be accepted.** All applications are date and time stamped when submitted.
- Submit completed applications to the Student Life & Leadership office, Student Services West 1661 (SSW-1661).
- Applications not duplicated will not be reviewed. **Nominees do not need to put their application in binders. Six paper copies of the application is all that is required and preferred.**
- Video applications will not be accepted.

## Section V: Activities and Involvement

Please list activities you have been involved in while at SDSU. Please organize your list as follows:

- Categories: Student/Greek Organizations, Councils, Volunteer Activities, Work Experience, Internships, Honors & Awards, other.
- Distinguish between current involvement and past involvement (include dates of involvement and order by year).
- Description includes: Name of involvement/activity, leadership position, and one-line description.

## Section VI: Spring Service Component

Please write a description of a unique service event that you would be interested in planning and coordinating for Spring 2010 if you are chosen as the Homecoming Queen or King. This event should address either a social or civic issue that is of personal interest to you and that would be of equal importance to the SDSU community whether by education, active participation, or service. Please speak on the challenges that this issue poses both to our community and to yourself, your vision for this event, goals, and steps you would take to ensure the success of your event.
