The College Area boundaries are Interstate 8 on the north, El Cajon Blvd. on the south, the border with the City of La Mesa on the east, and Collwood Blvd. and Fairmont Avenue on the west.

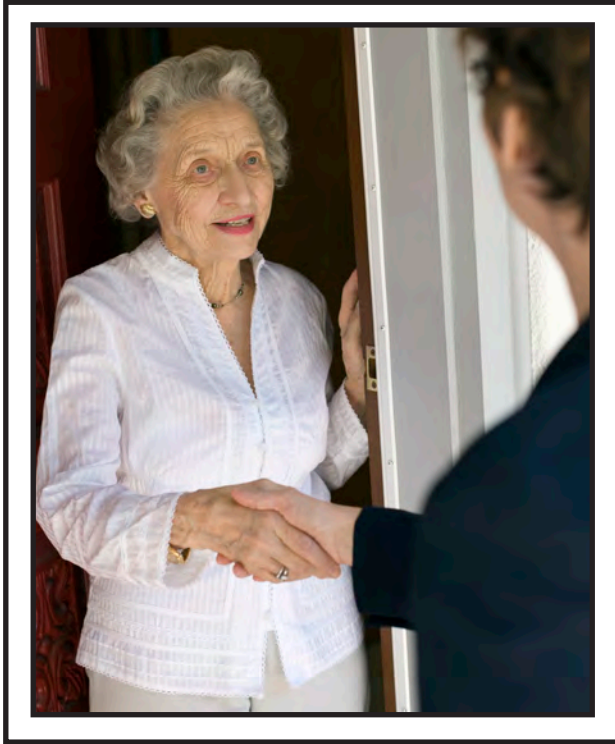

## Parking

---

### DO

- Get a B permit from [sandiego.gov/parking](http://sandiego.gov/parking)
- Park in your garage if possible
- Be courteous when parallel parking; leave space for others

### DON'T

- Over-extend into a sidewalk when parking
- Block driveways when parking
- Park on your lawn
- Park from 8AM-7AM without a B permit (most college area residents require B permits)

## Alcohol

---

### DO

- Drink safely and responsibly, in moderation
- Keep noise down from 10PM to 8AM
- Call a ride service if you need to get home

### DON'T

- Consume alcohol if you are under 21 years old
- Drink alcohol on any public property
- Charge money for admission to parties with alcohol
- Provide alcohol to anyone under 21
- Let your intoxicated friends walk home alone
